- 5. Updates from Community Advisory Committee Jennafer Griswold, CAC President
 - a. Membership Roster and Recruitment (Attachment 5a) Received resignation this week from our Public Information Officer-Lake Elsinore member. The PIO duties are to draft the CAC Newsletter's. While the position is vacant, RC SELPA will be taking on the newsletter.

6. Compliance Monitoring Activities - Leah Davis, Executive Director

a. Performance Indicator Review (PIR)

PIR-most of RC SELPA's LEAs have heard from CDE. Val Verde and Nuview have not received any feedback from CDE. Each LEA is:.

- Murrieta-scheduling individual meetings at each school site.
- Nuview-incorporating into existing meetings.
- Romoland-doing site visits with admin and pulling SpEd team. 3 year action plan.
- Perris Elementary-getting some push back from the union due to change.
- Menifee- biggest challenge is the Student Information System.
- Hemet-PIR in 3 different areas. Have had stakeholders meeting.
 Monitoring data to see progress.
- Beaumont- is continuing to implement PIR plan. Met with admin this week.
- Coachella- is developing a manual for procedures.
- Perris High-implemented a calculator that tracks percentages. SpEd Director will share. They have held PD workshops.
- Springs Charter-Assessment department is under new leadership. SpEd staff were invited to "Focusing on Data"
- Jurupa-aligned PIR to LCAP. Meetings are already set and will continue to monitor.
- Lake Elsinore- Teachers are in negotiations.
- Desert Sands-Stakeholders group is meeting soon.
- Alvord- One PIR indicator (expulsions). Tier I and 2 having difficulty with 5th year seniors.
- Val Verde- reviews discipline, ethnicity and graduation rate. Educating staff.

b. Disproportionality - 2018-19 Data Review (Handout)

18-19 Disproportionality Data has been uploaded into each LEAs Google Team Drive. Eight LEAs were identified to participate in a self study. Stakeholder's group for the state and SPP Tap consultants have made recommendations to the state. Four LEAs were identified as Disproportionate in the area of discipline. RC SELPA's Executive Director along with Improvement Facilitator's and two Coordinators went to Kentucky to present for the SIL grant. National Conference was held by NASDE/CASE. Will continue to keep you posted.

7. Riverside County SELPA Local Plan Revision Update

Ricky has scheduled a Local Plan Stakeholders meeting on Thursday, December 12, 2019 at 1:30 P.M.-3:30 P.M. There will be a total of 3 stakeholders meetings. Calendar invite will be sent out.

8. Private School Protocol - Debrief of Proportionate Share Meeting

A Private School Protocol meeting was held yesterday. We had representatives from 5 private schools SELPA wide. Some in person, some via zoom, including one parent. Goals were set. By holding SELPA wide meetings, we can use SELPA protocol. All Private schools in our boundaries were sent invites to attend a consultation meeting. This meeting will be held annually. Future meetings will be held in the Spring. Talked to group around Federal Law. Executive Director presented, the presentation was added to Google Team Drive to view.

- 9. Regionalized Program Transfers 2020-2021 School Year (Attachment 9) Chris Haney All letters were received from LEAs, that they would not take back programs, with the exception of Perris Elementary. They are taking back OT. When a district is considering taking programs back, there are timelines in place. If an LEA wants RCOE to make a program, there are no timelines.
- **10. Riverside County SELPA 2019-20 First Interim Budget Report** (Attachment 10) Leah Davis, Executive Director

Increase in revenue due to increase in our 602 dollars. Page 2 summarizes all components, with NPS costs zeroed out. Logging NPS costs as an abatement. No change in Out of Home care. SELPA Improvement Lead dollars carryover of \$700,000. Working with partnership SELPAs to do some cross sharing of funds. Will work on an MOU to make sure those dollars be expended. P-2 will be a little more reflective of what actual costs are. First Interim Budget was approved by SELPA Finance and will go to Governance on Wednesday.

- 11. Riverside County SELPA Staffing Update Leah Davis, Executive Director
 - Chad Petties-ERMHS Case Manager, from Val Verde USD
 - Clerk Typist III has accepted position. Position will go to the board in December, hopeful she starts before winter break.
