CAC will co-host a Movie Night on Thursday February 20th. This movie is a screening of "Intelligent Lives", about individuals with disabilities. Barbara Sorter from RCOE presented the movie to RC SELPA. Movie will be held at Val Verde High School gym. There will be popcorn, and other snacks.

6. Compliance Monitoring Activities - Leah Davis, Executive Director

Executive Director reviewed CDE PowerPoint with SELPA Updates. State SELPA-CDE is going to change compliance monitoring. Emma C court, lawsuit. Are they meeting federal requirements? Phase 1 required that they really look at data collection (single system of data collection). Looking for a way to monitor IEP implementation. Currently in Phase 2. Phase 3 and 4 will be monitoring activities.

- Issue 1- Will combine ADA to calculate for small LEAs. Aggregate students by County or/SELPA or a Hybrid.
- Verification review moved to comprehensive review.
- APR indicators translate to PIR.
- Timeline indicators translate to DINC.
- Intensive monitoring will be based on not meeting targets. Will be a single plan for all of this.
- Comprehensive review will now be called Intensive review.

Preschool Comprehensive review will have district specific indicators. For ages 3-5, CDE will use the 19-20 data. This version would identify 28 LEAs for preschool review. CDE will rely on federal guidance for Significant Disproportionality.

LEAs will receive a "Mega-Letter" in January. This letter will provide us with a timeline of activities. SELPA is hopeful that we receive a preview prior to the holidays. SELPA is committed to supporting our Directors.

7. Riverside County SELPA Local Plan Revision Update

SELPA Director held a small workgroup yesterday. Looked at all areas to assure practices are consistent with best practices. Next step would be a full collective group. February 13 will be the next meeting. Nominate members to attend, SELPA is looking on a large comprehensive view. The goal is to have the Local Plan's full revision by the next Coordinating Council. Local Plan will be adopted the following school year. 2020-21 school year the Local Plan will have to go to each LEA's governing boards. CAC would need to provide feedback. Templates have not been finalized by CDE. Participants may participate via Zoom by request. Register in OMS for meeting, so we can prepare accordingly.

8. Maintenance of Effort, Excess Cost, and Table 8 Reports - Bridget Akers

Pulled how much money was used on General Ed. Every district met those requirements. Had a few problems with calculations. Table 8 is a report that if you were in Sig Dis in this year or prior year. Palo Verde had to provide SELPA with some information. Palm Springs is in Sig Dis. Had 8 districts failing all four tests. Bridget was asked to hold a training. She will ask for input from your fiscal department. Local contribution worksheet was sent out at the beginning of the week.
