VIII. RC SELPA Executive Director Report SELPA Local Plan

- Leah gives a description of what the Local plan is. Riverside County SELPA falls under a Joint Power Agreement. Our Superintendents have an agreement that we work for the good of all. The Local Plan outlines what we do as a SELPA. Here are some highlights
- RC SELPA is a local control SELPA, which means we defer all decision making and program oversight to our districts. We still maintain a level of responsibility through dispute resolution; oversight of programs as far as compliance monitoring, making sure all components that are legally required to be in programs are there. SELPA acts as a liaison between CDE and the districts for compliance monitoring.

• We also work as the fiscal agent for our districts. SELPA receives all special education dollars, both federal and state; we have an agreed upon allocation plan that our Superintendents have agreed upon and how those dollars go out to districts.

PIR

 All compliance monitoring activities our districts were working on PIR plans during the previous CAC business meetings; they are now on the implementation phase. We have not received feedback from CDE on any of those plans. We have recommended that our districts begin implementing their plans. All plans had good intervention strategies. We have received a preview of the annual performance review data from CDE, that data looks positive. A number of our districts are making really good progress, especially in the area of graduation rates and in the area of student performance on the state wide assessments, and have seen growth in Least Restrictive Environment - those are public documents that will be released.
